




busy, even though we were having a late lunch. The coffee was good.





The biker pulled over and said, 'Build a bridge to Hawaii so I can ride over there anytime I want.'



Blood Pressure Monitors



We all either know someone or we ourselves are a victim of a heart attack. It's insidious and creeps up with often little warning. I feel I'm quite healthy, not ready for a heart attack, but,

my own Blood Pressure (BP) may be a tad high, 135/80 a week or so ago, so my doctor suggested monthly visits to check up on my BP. Always the one to go a step better I researched BP monitors and came across this little beauty, the Omron IA2. At the Heart shop in Pulteney Street they are \$185.00 and at National Pharmacies they are \$169.95, if your a member of FSMA then you get less 20%, either way it's cheap and it may just save your life.

I'm currently writing software to run on Windows XP that will allow you to enter the default date and time, the Systolic, Diastolic and pulse readings, my software will also allow you to enter your weight, a narrative on circumstances, like after a run, after a meal etc. and then do a printout for your doctor. The unit itself is so simple, you slip on a cuff on your left arm, position it, tighten it up via velcro, press the magic button, relax, watch it inflate, read and deflate, all automatically. It has a memory for the last 90 meetings, runs on batteries and is very portable indeed.

The supposed ideal reading is 120/80, it can creep higher dependant on your life style but if it's continually over 130 then do something about it!!

Blood pressure is measured in two ways:

Systolic - the highest pressure against the arteries as the heart pumps. The normal systolic pressure is usually between 110 and 130 mm Hg.

Diastolic - the pressure against the arteries as the heart relaxes and fills with blood. The normal diastolic pressure is usually between 70 and 80 mm Hg.

I'm not pushing this unit as much as trying to make club members aware of a simple solution to an age old problem. I won't bore you with the stats on heart disease, suffice to say it's quite deadly and if you live through it, I'm sure it's no fun and yet it is easily preventable. Monitor your BP, a little bit of exercise for us couch potatoes, mild change in our diet if needed, we could then ride our investments much longer.

When the software is complete I plan to give it away at no charge to any current member of the club, all a member has to do is email rob@berlinwall.com.au, register your interest and I will email you a copy. If it saves one members life I will be quite happy.

Lastly, it's not a personal unit, just for you, any member of your family and circle of friends can use it, it's got a two year warranty, whatever are you now waiting for, dying before your time is really up?

Attachments to hold badges in place

The screw on backings that I have used for quite a few years are actually used in model aircraft etc. I used to obtain them from a toy and hobby shop close to the back of the Wayville Showgrounds. The road is on the left from Anzac Hwy when driving out of the city. It is opposite the Ashford Hospital just before LeCornu's. I am sorry I do not have any other details of the place. I now purchase them locally (Mt Gambier) from Toy Stampede.

The items are 1/16" Plated Brass Dura-Collars

They come in a packet of 12 for about \$7.00.

Each collar has threaded into it a small Allen screw.

The pack includes a small Allen key to tighten them to the shank of the badge.

These stay put even when the garment is washed.

Don Freene's Anzac Biscuits

2cups rolled oats

- 2 cups plain flour
- 2 cups desiccated coconut

11/, cups caster sugar

- 250 grams butter
- 4 tablespoons golden syrup
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 2 tablespoons boiling water.

Set oven to 140°, lightly grease oven trays. Put oats, flour coconut, sugar into a big mixing bowl. Melt butter and golden syrup in a saucepan, stir until mixed, then remove from heat.

Mix baking soda and water in a cup and add to the melted butter mixture. Quickly add this to the dry ingredients. Mix well. Roll balls of mixture (about a dessert spoon size). Place onto trays, press lightly with a fork and bake for 17 minutes or until golden brown.
