Military Transport Museum 31st August

We left Port Wakefield at 9.00 am, the sky was very overcast threatening to rain at any minute (well it *was* the last day of winter), but we just made it to Edinburgh Park with seconds to spare.

The guided tour was very interesting and lots of questions were asked regarding the diverse range of military vehicles on display, which our guide answered fully displaying an excellent knowledge of the exhibits. There we were worrying about a few drops of rain, but compared to the conditions that our soldiers endured during the various conflicts, our problems would pale into insignificance.

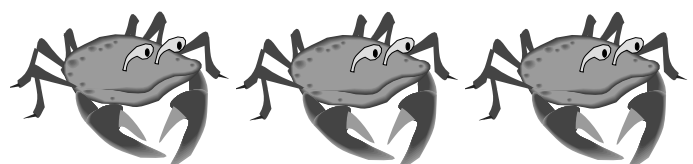

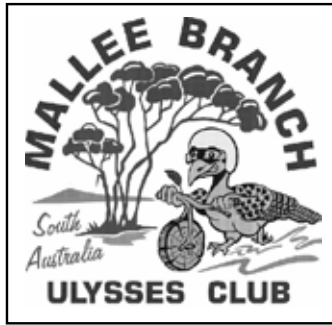

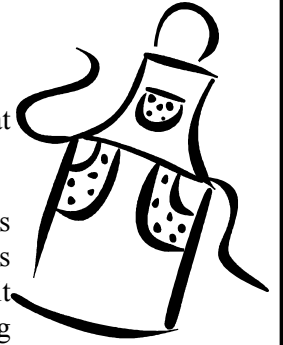
