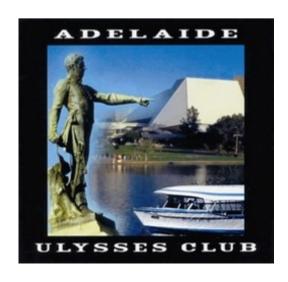

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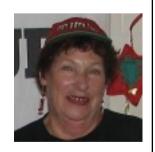


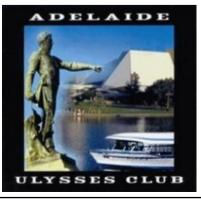

On our return trip on Sunday several more Mallee members gave up their usual coffee and chat session and rode with us to Morgan and Blanchetown before leaving us.

Most of us rode up on Friday afternoon in warm weather. Shaun "Horse" Pomery was so keen he came down from Moorook to Birdwood to be with us for the trip up. He's got the right attitude (any excuse for a ride!). Ken Wagnitz plotted our journeys on his GPS to share with others using GPS. That is most helpful – thank you so much Ken.

With roadworks, slow vehicles and a break for welcome cool drinks, we didn't arrive at Barmera until almost six o'clock. Guy Malpass, Gary Parker, John Long and Dom and Sue Carli arrived later. They missed the excessive five kilometre doddle at 40 kph for minor roadworks.

Our accommodation at the Barmera Hotel was cheap and the meals were good. The small air-conditioners worked overtime that night to cool our rooms after a hot day.

Saturday was even hotter. We didn't take off until 10. Just as we were about to leave Rob and Judy Hartridge arrived from Adelaide. They didn't have time to get off their bikes before they were away on the first ride to the old World War II internment camp site at Loveday and the well-known historic Overland Corner Pub. After a brief stop at the old camp site, we had a good break at Overland Corner, resting under the trees where several other bikers were also enjoying a cool drink. Afterwards we rode back to the Visitor Information Centre in Barmera to see a display and relics from the internment camp.

Some of us had lunch at the Lakeside Cafe overlooking Lake Bonney. After lunch we did the loop ride. Our first stop was at the old water tower lookout over Berri. Someone counted ninety steps — we were all a bit puffed on reaching the top. It's the

After passing through Renmark, our next stop was Lock 5 and the old "Bunyip" barge near the Paringa Bridge. We then rode through Lyrup and Loxton North where Terry Wilksch's son saw his biking father from the golf course, but dad was too interested in the new housing on the other side of the road to notice his son!

We were all hot by the time we reached Loxton. Luckily one shop was open and we all had a cool drink or ice-cream or both while we rested. Then, after Terry was rounded up late, we headed off through Moorook to the lookout near the Kingston bridge. Some of us recalled the old days, when the ferry there, and others at Blanchetown and Berri were a constant source of delays on roads that were busy by the time the bridges were built – that was real progress for the Riverland.

After the ride we had dinner at the pub again and a hot night with air-conditioners working overtime until the morning when we were greeted by cool cloudy weather and rain. Putting on wet weather gear got rid of the rain as it so often does. We rode off around the lake and past the Overland Corner Pub before the lovely sweepers on Devlin Pound Road. We just caught the ferry at Waikerie and headed up to the Viewpoint Cafe for morning tea and the spectacular view over the river from the high cliffs.

Then it was on to the next ferry crossing at Cadell and the roadhouse in Morgan where we had an early lunch. We crossed the ferry again at Morgan and headed to Blanchetown, noticing the wind becoming stronger. There our friends from the Riverland left us to ride back home. We went on to Truro, Moculta and Angaston before stopping at the Mengler's Hill lookout. Then we rode to Maggie Beer's and lastly Seppelt's winery. We then headed off home, some of us enduring more showers on the way.

It was a successful weekend. It had a purpose preparing us for the AGM, but it was also fun in the best traditions of our great club, and there were no incidents or problems with bikes. Viva Ulysses!!

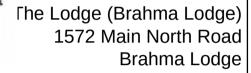

Missed by millimetres I was told later by one years. The weather was perfect, the bikasrrified rider who saw it all play out in front of him.

> We finally made it to Mt Pleasant for morning tea after I shortened the ride to make up for lost time. Just before we left I gathered everyone together for a debrief. After what we had just been through it was necessary to get everyone back into present time, settled down. Our run to One Tree Hill took us through Springton, Eden Hills, Menglers Hill, Lyndoch, Williamstown and Kersbrook.

On arrival in SA Kim bought his first Bike here in Oz, an Adler 250 which for those not in the know, is a "Go Fast" Two stroke (see pic below).

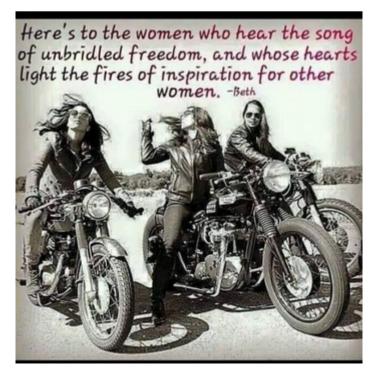
Like many Ulyssians, along came marriage and kids and out went the motorbikes.

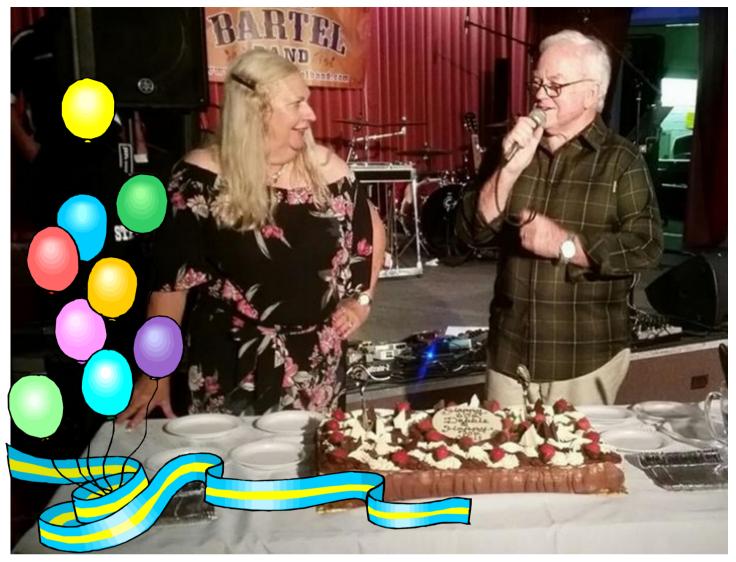

The AGM Calendar

If you are going to the Riverland AGM, you will be interested in the schedule of events.

In case you haven't noticed, there is a menu item on the Adelaide Branch website labelled **2018 AGM Event Calendar** brings up a full width Google Calendar of all the AGM events.

It's the same one you get from the AGM website **Program** tem, but without the surrounding 'stuff'.

You can view this calendar in a web browser, on your PC, tablet, or smartphone. Any last-minute changes will appear on it.

If you want, you can merge the AGM calendar with your personal calendar. That makes it very easy to see the schedule on your phone when at the AGM Event.

At the bottom of the *2018 AGM Event Calendar* is a link to instructions for adding the AGM calendar to your personal calendar. Note that the first step needs to be done on your PC.

The Internet for Old Farts

TV Tuner Dongles

Smart TVs are all the rage these days. Connect them up to your home WiFi, and you can stream *ABC iViewSBS On Dema(noly*) two favourites), *NetflixStan,Spotify*etc etc. They are all streaming services, which means they stream content to your TV as you watch, rather than downloading a whole program before you watch it. These things all use Internet data, so you'd want 100GB of monthly data allowance or more, if you are going to watch much streamed TV.

You can also watch the live TV channels from the Internet if your TV reception is lousy. (Again, chewing up data.)

But there is no smarter TV than one with a computer plugged in. Do you have a laptop with a HDMI output? Try that. You can then watch live TV and record it, using a tuner dongle. This is a TV tuner which plugs in to a USB port on your computer. The TV antenna connection plugs in to the other end.

The dongles come with a program which set them up, and allow tuning, live viewing, recording, playback etc. Alternatively, if you are lucky enough to be running Windows 7, you will have *WindowsMedia Center* on your computer, which will detect your TV tuner dongle, and use it.

An alternative to a dongle is a plug in TV tuner card, if you have a desktop computer with a spare slot. These are neater than a dongle, but may be more expensive.

TV Tuner dongles are very cheap, especially from eBay and the like, but around \$30 or less in big stores like JB HiFi, Good Guys, Harvey

Norman etc.

For experimenters, the dongles can even be used as wideband radio receivers, with extra (free) software.

TV Aerials

If you live in the suburbs, chances are high that you have the wrong TV aerial for your area.

We are now fully digital, and the channels have been moved to allow old TV channel space to be used for mobile phones. Suburban TV is now all on the high end of VHF. This means the UHF part of a combination UHF-VHF antenna, is not only superfluous, but it can be picking up mobile phone signals and interfering with your reception.

So, if you occasionally suffer from a broken-up picture due to interference, and you have a combination antenna, try disconnecting or removing the UHF part. -This is a bit with the really short elements. If you lose stations as a result, just put that bit back, but its probable you will reduce interference.

Maybe you need to buy a new antenna (or make one from the plans in the Feb 2018 *Silicon Chip* magazine). If you do, make sure its the correct one for your area. Don't buy a cheap antenna from overseas.

And if you climb on the roof to fiddle with the antenna, take care. Lots of old farts fall off ladders.

Phones for old farts

Do you have a cheap phone with little internal memory, but it takes an SD memory

card?

Do you have a flash phone with an SD memory card, but all the apps you have loaded cause you to get "low memory" messages?

Fear not, Android phone owners (sorry Apple people, Steve Jobs

decreed you can't have extra memory cards), you may be able to improve things.

Transfer apps and their data to your SD card, freeing up internal memory.

Here's how you do it:

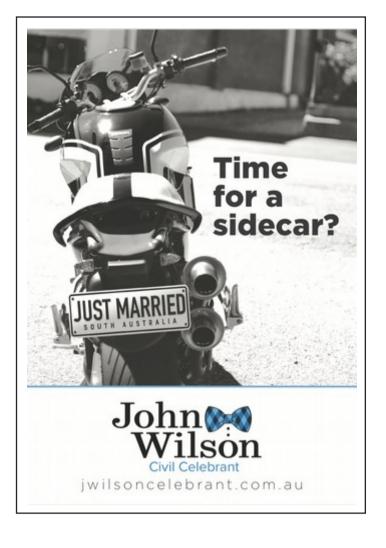
- In Settings, click on Application Manager (or equivalent).
- Go through your apps, clicking on the *Storage* item.
- Look for apps where the Storage page shows a Stored in menu.
- When you find one, click on Change.
- Then choose SD card, and click on Change. The app and its data will move to the SD card, freeing up internal memory.

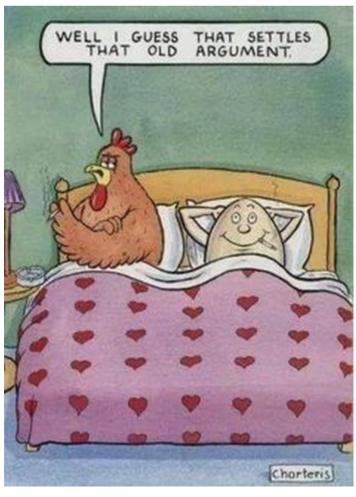
Having done that, make sure you don't remove the SD card, or those apps won't work.

Of course the other way to free up memory is to remove apps you don't use.

And if you automatically download podcasts, these probably store in internal memory. You can manually move them to the SD card. Then once you've listened to a podcast, delete it.













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
