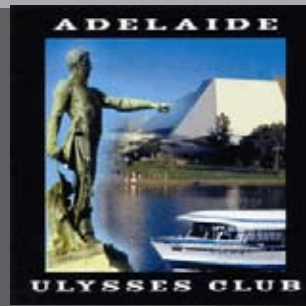

Road Safety presentations for the 2015-16 Financial Year

The Road Safety Section (RSS) continues to deliver quality Road Safety education across South Australia without cost to the public and with regard to the best practice principles of Road Safety. The RSS continues our successful relationship with the Motor Accident Commission (MAC) in delivering the following Road Safety sessions during the 2015-16 fiscal year: -

- 856 sessions in schools. This included 228 sessions of the Introduction to Road Safety at the Road Safety Centre where primary and pre-primary children are introduced to using the road system safely. There were 338 crossing monitor training sessions at primary schools to authorise monitors to operate School Crossings safely. At secondary schools there were 290 sessions delivered (89 sessions for Year 10 to assist students to obtain their learners and probationary licence;

7 sessions for Year 10 in Road Safety Science for student to understand the forces at work in crashes; 145 sessions for Year 11 directed at the choices, risks and consequences in being a road user when students are driving for the first time and 49 sessions for Year 12 students to discuss road safety further just as drivers are leaving school).

- 5 sessions were conducted directed at people who are supervising learner drivers
- 98 Business Driver Awareness programs for people who drive as part of their work .
- 38 sessions targeted at senior road users and the challenges for these road users as they get older.
- 50 sessions delivered to country football leagues in partnership with the SANFL about the responsible use of alcohol and using the road system safely.
- 34 sessions completed for neighbourhood watch groups, service clubs and car clubs discussing road safety topics.
- 15 TAFE & Apprentice systems as an introduction to driving safety at work.
- 70 Road Safety Displays, Voluntary Breath Testing Stations and Mock Crashes.

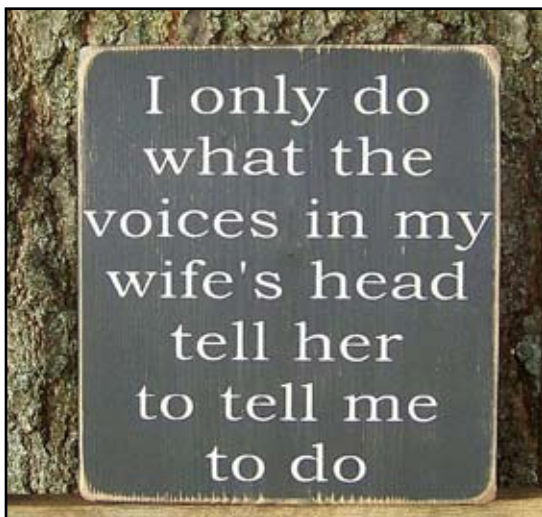
No stone will be left unturned to make this 25th Odyssey a memorable and relaxing one.

From the Pres' Desk



It's been a relatively uneventful year for the Adelaide branch. No controversies or major disagreements I can think of. Meetings have been fairly well attended. Rides haven't, but that's been very dependent on weather, and we've had some lousy Sundays of late.

We have a hard core of Sunday riders, and plenty of 'fair weather' riders, of whom I'm one. Monthly dinners have continued, also with variable numbers.

Our weekenders haven't been very well attended, though those of us who've gone have enjoyed ourselves. Considering quite a few thought weekenders are desirable in the survey we did a couple of years back, I have to wonder what we've done wrong. One recurring problem is having events collide with those of other branches and other pursuits altogether. I'm trying to get our local branches more on the same page, but it's an uphill battle. If members want to see different activities, then we need both the suggestions, and the people to see them through. As with most clubs, it's a small group of regulars who do most of the work. FDNY Dream Bike

Collection 9/11 Memorial Museum, Gift of Ladder Company 9 and Engine Company 33, in memory of Gerard Baptiste

In summer 2001, Firefighter Gerard Baptiste of FDNY Ladder Company 9, purchased a battered 1979 Honda motorcycle, model CB750. Baptiste believed that he could restore it to good working order. His fellow firefighters joked that it would take time and money just to start the engine. Following Baptiste's death in the North Tower on 9/11, the broken-down motorcycle remained at the firehouse until a memorial tribute in *Backroads* magazine inspired Baptiste's colleagues to restore the bike in his memory. Surviving members of Ladder Company 9, with support from Honda and motorcycle enthusiasts nationwide, transformed the motorcycle into a "bike of healing" known as the Dream Bike. Ten roses painted on the cover of its gas tank symbolize the members of Ladder Company 9 and Engine Company 33 who were killed on 9/11.

The FDNY Dream Bike article was sent in by **John Crowe**.
The bike is fire engine red and looks quite remarkable.

The Internet for Old Farts - Calendaring

Google Calendar

Life gets busy. Most of us use a calendar of some sort to manage the various things competing for our time. It can range from a hung up butcher's free wall-calendar with scribbles on it, to an online calendar shared across devices and people.

I'd like to talk about the latter.

Rides, dinners, events etc are listed on the Adelaide Branch website on the Events and Rides pages. But they also appear on the Event Calendar page which shows our Google Calendar.

Anyone with an Android smartphone has a Google account. (If you don't then you are only using 1% of the capability of your phone.) With a Google account comes gmail, and Google Calendar, all for free. Even iPhone owners can use gmail and Google Calendar on their phones with the appropriate app.

Sharing

The calendar on my phone and on my computer at home, shows my calendar entries, Michele's calendar entries, the Ulysses Adelaide calendar entries, and Google's idea of Australian public holidays. Michele's is shared with me (and only me), while the Adelaide Branch one is public, readable by anyone. Likewise, my calendar is shared with the missus. Seeing her events in my calendar makes life easier for me, because she is the family 'secretary', organising our social engagements.

Alerting

The Google Calendar can send me alerts of events - minutes, hours, days, ahead of their happening. These can be via email, popup, or SMS. They are free. Birthdays and anniversaries of family and friends can be entered as an annually recurring event. A reminder of one of those can be a life saver.

How to include another calendar

On a smartphone, you get to the calendar via an app. On Android phones, you save new events in either

the phone's calendar, or the Google calendar. Make sure you choose the latter, so it coincides with what you see on the PC. (Once you choose one, that is the default next time.) On the PC, if you are using gmail, click on the Google apps button, top right (9 dots in a square), choose 'Calendar'. The calendar account will be the same as the gmail account. (You can have multiple gmails of different accounts open at the same time, in different browser tabs.)



To add some else's calendar to your view, you have to use the PC. Click on the 'Other Calendars' item on the left side of the calendar page. In the text box, you can add the gmail account of someone else. If you want to add the Adelaide Branch calendar, put ulyssesadelaide@gmail.com in there. You should immediately see our rides, dinners, etc.,

appear in your calendar.

(Note: All the above assumes you are connected to the Internet.)

And now you'll see same on your phone's calendar.

Wouldn't it be nice...

I emailed all the SA branches (and Broken Hill), suggesting they use a Google Calendar like Adelaide Branch does, then I could present a combination of all participating branches on our website, and provide code for them to do same on theirs.

This would mean easier event planning for all branches, and simple checking to see who next has a ride or whatever. Also, for branches doing it, their members could include their branch calendar in their own personal calendar.

I got a response from two branches on it, nothing from the rest. and even for those two, it seems to be all too hard. (It ain't that hard!) Sigh.

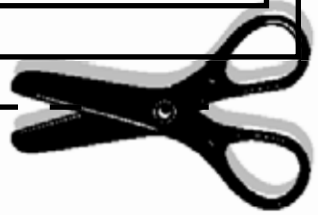

Merrawyn's Mulberry Flan

(Makes 2.)

Pastry:

1 cup sr flour
1 cup plain flour
125gm butter
2 tbl sugar
1 egg & 2 tbl milk

Rub butter into flour & sugar.

Add egg & milk combined.

Roll out thin.

Bake 200C about 10 mins. total.

After 5 mins, remove from oven & press pastry base & sides flat, using a clean tea towel.

Resume cooking until pastry appears dry & slightly coloured.
Cool.

Filling:

1 margarine container of mulberrys
2 tbl currants (about a handful)
1 cotees port wine or raspberry jelly
1 tbl butter
2 tbl sugar
2 tbl cornflour mixed to thin paste with minimum water

Cover with water & boil 10 mins.

Thicken with cornflour mix.

Allow to cool a little, then pour into cooled base.

Toppings:

When cold, cover mulberrys with whipped cream which has about 2 tsp of vanilla instant pudding added.

Or just serve with whipped cream on side.

Road Safety presentations for the 2015-16 Financial Year

The Road Safety Section (RSS) continues to deliver quality Road Safety education across South Australia without cost to the public and with regard to the best practice principles of Road Safety. The RSS continues our successful relationship with the Motor Accident Commission (MAC) in delivering the following Road Safety sessions during the 2015-16 fiscal year: -

- 856 sessions in schools. This included 228 sessions of the Introduction to Road Safety at the Road Safety Centre where primary and pre-primary children are introduced to using the road system safely. There were 338 crossing monitor training sessions at primary schools to authorise monitors to operate School Crossings safely. At secondary schools there were 290 sessions delivered (89 sessions for Year 10 to assist students to obtain their learners and probationary licence;

7 sessions for Year 10 in Road Safety Science for student to understand the forces at work in crashes; 145 sessions for Year 11 directed at the choices, risks and consequences in being a road user when students are driving for the first time and 49 sessions for Year 12 students to discuss road safety further just as drivers are leaving school).

- 5 sessions were conducted directed at people who are supervising learner drivers
- 98 Business Driver Awareness programs for people who drive as part of their work .
- 38 sessions targeted at senior road users and the challenges for these road users as they get older.
- 50 sessions delivered to country football leagues in partnership with the SANFL about the responsible use of alcohol and using the road system safely.
- 34 sessions completed for neighbourhood watch groups, service clubs and car clubs discussing road safety topics.
- 15 TAFE & Apprentice systems as an introduction to driving safety at work.
- 70 Road Safety Displays, Voluntary Breath Testing Stations and Mock Crashes.
