A Run-Down of Rides in 2015

In 2015, as the Adelaide Ulysses Rides Coordinator, I led 22 Sunday rides. We had to cancel 3 more scheduled due to high forecast temperatures, and Andrew Mill was ride leader for the first 3 rides of that year.

On those 22 rides that I led we stopped 44 times at 22 places for morning tea and lunch. If you were on all of those rides you would have travelled 3634 km, plus the distance to the start, and the ride home.

Our longest ride (208 km) was on 30th August when we went from McDonalds Trinity Gardens to Truro for morning tea, and back to Gumeracha via Annandale and Sedan. Stopping this time at the Toy Factory where we had room to park, we could get a feed, and visit the toy factory if that took your fancy.

Our shortest ride (101 km) was to the Freenes for lunch, stopping at Balhannah for morning tea.

There were many memorable moments - here are few that some may recall.

The rude woman towing the horse float from Clarendon to Kangarilla travelling at about 30 kmh and slowing down for corners. I finally pulled her over on Dashwood road and some of our riders got past before she just cut back onto the road again hurling abuse from her open window.

My first ride as a leader into McLaren Vale had me directing every one into the wrong carpark. Bit embarrassed about that.

Half of the group being led up the wrong road near Lenswood because a rider decided that we had turned right because the road ahead was dirt. It was actually just roadworks for about 200 metres. Ironically the rider that did this was on an 'adventure' bike. It all ended ok as Ken took the rest of the group to our morning tea stop.

The ride to the Truck and Ute show at Mannum was a particularly good one. We had parking arranged right next to the displays, and all of us spent some time wandering around the exhibits. A highlight for me was the bark of the Rolls Royce Merlin engine, belching flames from the stubby exhausts.

The guy who dropped in on us at lunch at McLaren Vale on a WW2 BMW outfit, accurately restored to original condition, complete with 2 spare wheels, a blanket, shovel, some rope and an old military radio.

Getting a phone call from Trevor Thomas while we were travelling towards Meadows to let me know that Peter Wood had hit a kangaroo. Trevor and some others remained there until a farmer came along to shoot the unfortunate kangaroo. We stopped by the side of the road and waited for about 30 minutes for the riders to catch up. No damage done to Peter and his BMW.

The last ride of the year to Victor Harbor was a beauty, however there was only 3 of us at the start and 4 from our morning tea stop at Meadows.

Of the 22 places we stopped at, 11 of these were visited only once, 5 places were stopped at twice, 5 others were stopped at 3 times, and only one place hosted us 4 times. That was at Meadows - twice for morning tea and twice for lunch. One of these lunches was at Bob's huge workshop.

We had lunch at Angaston (1), Birdwood (1), Clayton Bay (1), Gumeracha (1), Hahndorf (2), Little Hampton (1), Lobethal (1), Lyndoch (2), Mannum (1), McLaren Vale (2), Meadows (2), Murray Bridge (1), Strathalbyn (1), Victor Harbor (1), Wellington (1) and Williamstown (1). Also we had lunch at the Freenes in St Marys, and at the Wagnitzes in Craigburn Farm.

For most of the riders who joined us in 2016 there were lots of new roads and different ways to get to places. It was an absolute pleasure to have the opportunity to do this. To see that so many people enjoy these rides, and the many times they expressed this to me has kept me motivated. I'm looking forward to more rides in 2016. **Frank Pellas**

Recollections from Neville & Pam Gray....

Liz joined the Ulysses Club on 8th April 1997. I remember the first time we met on her first Club ride. It was to Coobowie on the Yorke Peninsula as pillion on husband Ken's Virago 1100 at about mid-1997. Both got horribly lost on their way to Coobowie and arrived somewhat flustered and red faced. A few weeks later, Liz rocked up on her



very own first bike, a Suzuki GN250 complete with 'L' plates. Boy, she gave that poor little thing the berries as we rode 500 kms to and from Bowman Park, just out of Crystal Brook, in the Mid North. (There were 96 of us on that memorable ride and we ran out of roast chickens and had to go to town to top up). I was Ride Leader for the day and observing her in the rear vision mirror sent shivers down my spine. She was completely fearless and attacked each corner with determination and gusto, pushing that little 250 way beyond its design limits in her attempt to keep up with the mob.

A few weeks later, Liz faced the RiderSafe test to gain her Provisional Licence, and told us in confidence that she actually slid on the bike, during the test, and ran between the Instructor's legs. Somehow she passed, and so began her love affair, not only with the Ulysses Club, but with the bikes she owned and rode. Many years later, Liz fulfilled a long held ambition to race a Production Yamaha LC250, and while on her first race at McNamara Park in Mount Gambier, lost it big time and broke her lower leg quite badly. That was her first and only foray into motorcycle racing. Of course, that GN did not last long and so began a succession of sports bikes, including a Yamaha R1 super rocket, that ladies simply were not supposed to ride, but ride them she did, again with a high degree of skill.

Liz was an intelligent person and while the Adelaide Branch President, ran the meetings both social and Committee, with decorum and was always prepared to listen to everyone's opinion on any subject that came up. She was well up in the TAFE system and as a professional hair-dresser, rose up the ranks to become Head Honcho at the Light Square Complex until she had to resign because of ill health.

At NatCom AGMs, Liz loved to wear her 'Helga head piece'. a blonde wig with two long plaits down the back. It was quite appropriate as she and Ken spent some years working in Germany while Ken was a Professional Tennis Coach. Later on during her sickness, a blonde wig was also worn for other reasons.

Liz's tenacity in adversity was phenomenal. She and Ken came to our place 3 years ago, just after Christmas, together with a few old Adelaide Branch members. She obviously was in very poor health. Liz confided that she probably wouldn't see another Christmas, but then surprised us all and started a new course of treatment and went on and on. Liz adored getting and having big hugs such was her loving character.

Ride on Liz, you were an inspiration to everyone that knew you. Everyone, please look after Ken!!

Recollections from Wendy King....

My earliest recollection of Liz was about 18 years ago, when we both got our motorbike licences about the same time. We spent some time at an AGM discussing the pros and cons of various bikes, having a difference of preference in that I needed a cruiser and Liz liked the sports/road type.

Liz was a teacher of hairdressing at TAFE, and an Ardrossan hair-dresser who was one of Liz's apprentices, speaks fondly of her.

When Liz was elected President of the Adelaide Branch, she broke the 'glass ceiling' in that we believe she was the first female president in the Ulysses Club. At the very least, she was first in South Australia.

Liz always had a zest for life and this was demonstrated by her 'having a go' at Mac Park. Unfortunately, this didn't end as Liz would have hoped, breaking her ankle. I think it was this zest for life that kept Liz doing her best to stay with us as long as she did. She will be missed by many.

Recollections from Sue Freene....

Liz was a tower of strength to me when we were both having chemo at the Tennyson Centre in Adelaide.

On my first visit, Liz came in especially to be with me while I was being hooked up to the machines. She had a great sense of humour and brought in cocktail glasses filled with green cordial and we sat and drank them. The staff there thought it was a hoot and the other patients had a laugh.

We were on much the same program, although Liz's procedures were a lot more taxing on her and a lot more invasive. She bore all her treatments bravely and with courage and dignity. She was one of the bravest women I have ever met and never once complained or questioned "why her".

She was a wonderful friend, both to me and to the Ulysses Club and I will miss her.



Neville Gray, Road Safety representative from South Australia, has his Top Ten Tips for riding - here they are

1. Look for other road users that are not looking for you. Ride conspicuously and never in blind spots. Never assume that the other vehicle will stop.

2. Riders, unlike car drivers with aids such as air bags, collapsible steering columns and the stability of four wheels, have only their hazard perception and avoidance skills and their protective clothing to make them safer. Therefore keep your attention level high.

3. Always wear good quality protective clothing from your head to your feet. Protect your extremities with helmet, gloves and leg and arm protection in all weather conditions.

4. Most cars can stop quicker than most motorcycles especially in emergency situations. Therefore always keep a3 second gap to the vehicle in front of you.

5. Always perform a head check before changing lanes. Just looking in your mirrors is not good enough.

6. It is vital to ride at a speed to suit the prevailing conditions. In bad weather, this could mean at a speed under the posted speed limit

7. Riding under the influence of alcohol and drugs is plain suicidal. You need all of your faculties at a high level to successfully ride a motorcycle.

8. Don't forget the safety of your pillion as well as your own. They too need good protective clothing, be informed about the dynamics of a motorcycle and know how to assist the rider by being a good stable pillion.

9. Never lend your motorcycle to riders who are unlicensed or inexperienced.

10. Intersections are high risk areas. Slow down when approaching an intersection cover your brakes and be ready to avoid a possible collision.

Hardy: "The men are a bit worried about shooting at anyone, Admiral."

Nelson: "What? This is mutiny!"

Hardy: "It's not that, sir. It's just that they're afraid of being charged with murder if they actually kill anyone. There are a couple of legal-aid lawyers on board, watching everyone like hawks."

Nelson: "Then how are we to sink the French and the Spanish?"

Hardy: "Actually, sir, we're not."

Nelson: "We're not?"

Horatio Nelson, 1st Viscount Nelson, 1st Duke of Bronté KB (29 September 1758 – 21 October 1805) was a British flag officer in the Royal Navy. He was noted for his inspirational leadership, superb grasp of strategy, and unconventional tactics, all of which resulted in a number of decisive



naval victories, particularly during the Napoleonic Wars. He was wounded several times in combat, losing one arm in the unsuccessful attempt to conquer Santa Cruz de Tenerife and the sight in one eye in Corsica. He was shot and killed during his final victory at the Battle of Trafalgar in 1805.






