Thai Chicken Curry:

8 chicken thighs (1 kg),
chopped
1 jar salsa
1/4 cup peanut butter
2 tbl lime juice
1 tbl soy sauce
1 tbl crushed ginger
Garnish - 1/4 cup chopped
peanuts & coriander (optional)



Method -

Mix peanut paste, salsa, lime juice, soy & ginger in
a bowl.

Brown chicken in fry pan.

Add sauce to chicken and simmer.

Serve on bed of rice, sprinkle over peanuts &
chopped coriander.

Potato, Chorizo & Spinach Bake:

(lovely with salad on a hot day)

3 large potatoes (600g), peeled

450g sweet potato, peeled

1/2 x 270g jar of char-grilled capsicum strips,
drained (or do your own)

75g baby spinach leaves, shredded

2/3 cup grated tasty cheese

150g fresh ricotta, crumbled

10 eggs, room temperature

300g carton sour cream

1/3 cup milk

1 clove garlic, crushed

1 small red onion, halved cut into thin wedges

1 chorizo sausage, thinly sliced

2 tbl finely chopped parsley

Oven 180deg C or 160deg C fan forced.

Grease 22cm round cake pan, line base & sides
with baking paper, place on tray.

Pierce potatoes with a skewer.

Microwave on High for 4 mins or until just tender,
cool for 5 mins, then slice.

Arrange half the sliced potato (both types) over
base.

Top with half capsicum, spinach, tasty cheese
ricotta.

Repeat layers, finishing with ricotta.

Whisk eggs, sour cream, milk & garlic in a large
jug.

Season with salt.

Pour egg mix over vegies in dish.

Toss onion & chorizo together, then arrange oer top
of dish.

Cover with foil, bake 1 hour.

Remove foil, bake for 45 mins more or until golden
brown & vegies are tender.

Sprinkle with parsley.

Stand in pan for 3 hours or until completely cooled.

Remove from pan, cut into wedges to serve.

Day ride to Lobethal on 14th January

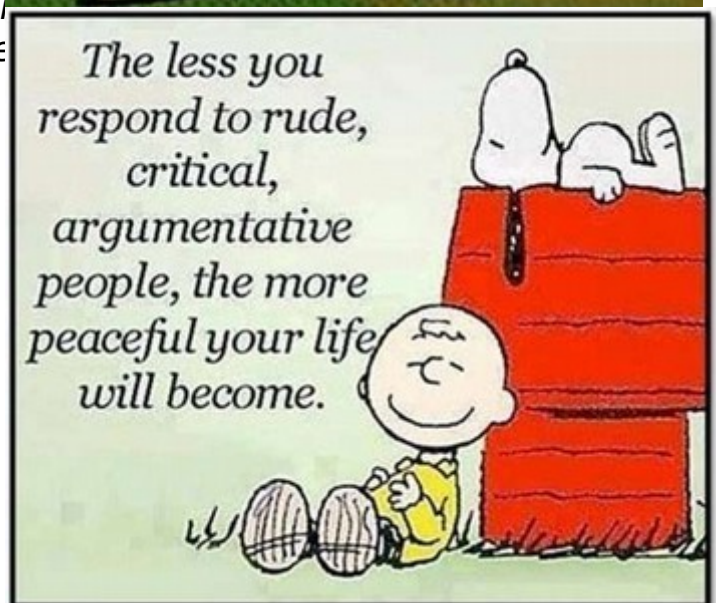
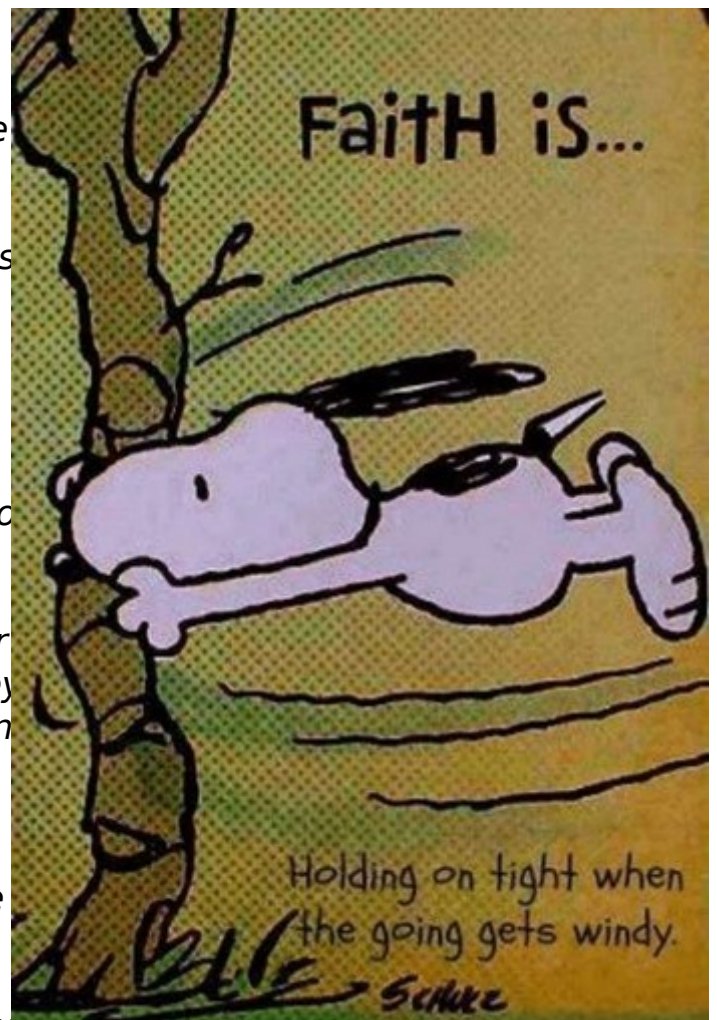
